**RECREATION GROUND MANAGEMENT**

Grass – Chafer grub is rife at present. It was agreed that a key to the plant room should be given to either Guy Bewick or Pete Laude in the short term but also get a quote for the water tank switch to be in moved to changing rooms.

Clerk to contact Jordi to explain that the Parish Council are keen to be able accommodate their team but current weather conditions and chafer problems has suspended use of the grounds for 2 weeks, however a plan is being put in place to accommodate them coming to the grounds.
